A North Carolina native with a B.S. degree in Interior Design from Western Carolina University, Susan has practiced interior design throughout Western North Carolina since 1982. She has managed her solo design firm since 1987. Current projects include the redecoration on The Thomas Wolfe Auditorium for the Asheville Civic Center Commission, the design of several major homes under construction and on the drawing board and the renovation and redecoration of many spaces for private residential and commercial clients.

Completed projects include the Richmond Hill Inn, Cottages and Carriage House; the renovation of the City Building of Asheville for The City of Asheville and interior design plans for the southeastern headquarters for the U.S. Forestry Service. In addition, Nilsson recently completed interior design work for Busbee Lodge on the grounds of the Biltmore Estate.

Working with contractor/husband Jon Nilsson, Susan is in the midst of a major renovation for Far Acres, a 1940's farmhouse in Asheville. Furnishing used in the design of this master bedroom will be used at Far Acres after the showhouse closes.

Active in the community, Ms. Nilsson is a professional member of the Junior League of Asheville and the Northwest Chapter of the American Society of Interior Designers and the Preservation Society of Asheville. She is a professional member of ASID and serves as showhouse chairman for the Carolinas Chapter of ASID.
